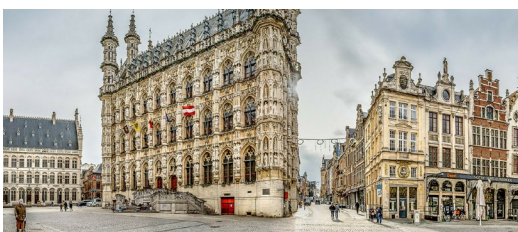


Newsletter

EAGG update

The European ADHD Guidelines Group is working on several papers: Meta-analysis of psychological interventions (led Alessio Bellato & David Daley), Systematic review on provision of clinical services for ADHD (Diane Purper-Ouakil & Cesar Soutullo), Neurodiversity (Alessio Bellato & Sven Bölte), Emotion dysregulation (Emily Simonoff), ADHD and restricted professions (Sven Bölte).



Cooperation with ADHD Europe

EUNETHYDIS has formalized its collaboration with ADHD Europe, the European umbrella organisation for ADHD, which represents self-support patient ADHD advocacy NGOs comprising of charities, family support groups, and other grass roots organisations (adhdeurope.eu). The collaboration between EUNETHYDIS and ADHD Europe focuses on joint activities, regular interaction, and knowledge exchange. Key elements include co-organizing an annual webinar, mutual participation in each other's meetings, and sharing relevant information with their networks. Both organisations also contribute expertise to each other's initiatives. Additional collaboration opportunities - such as awareness campaigns and joint work through the World Federation for ADHD - will be explored as appropriate.
